The museum is open 7 days a week from 9am to 5pm until September 30, 2017. Admission is free but donations for \$8 per adult are recommended to help with the operation and upkeep of the museum.

While the museum was closed over the winter a lot of work was happening behind the scenes. A team of dedicated volunteers were hard at work updating exhibitions and adding displays such as the Lincoln Sport homebuilt display. Work is underway on the PB5-5A flying boat to restore it back to the Eastern Provincial Airways colours it wore on its final flight.
