Speed Mentoring in Quebec – May 7, 2015

After a grand success in 2014, in collaboration with Heroux Devtek, the following entities: Women in Aerospace (WIA)in Québec, l'École de technologie supérieure (ÉTS) and the Polytechnique of Montreal, hosted an important Speed Mentoring event on May 7, 2015. The event brought together 23 local university students, all interested in learning more about the pursuit of careers in aerospace, from men and women already in the industry. With professors, mentors and volunteers, more than 50 participants took part in this second edition. The event was held at the ÉTS, Pavilion B Hall. The venue and the format, a combination of 5-minute rounds of one-on-one discussions, were suitable for sharing personal career stories, and other universities wishing to join the initiative, the 2016 edition should definitely be engaging for most.



The National Space Society's 34th International Space Development Conference – May 20-24, 2015

The National Space Society's 34th International Space Development Conference, co-hosted by The Canadian Space Commerce Association (CSCA) was held in Toronto on May 20-24, 2015.

Approximately 700 attendees, students and more than 50 National Space Society chapters from the United States, Canada and around the world gathered for this exciting and historical event to exchange innovative ideas for the advancement of Space Travel and Settlement.

Some of the brightest minds and forward thinkers gathered for this event. Those sharing their history and their stories included; Buzz Aldrin, Astronaut, Explorer, Rocket Scientist; the Hon. Marc Garneau, Member of Parliament, Former President of the Canadian Space Agency, First Canadian Astronaut in Space; and Anousheh Ansari, the First Astronaut of Iranian decent and the First Muslim woman to visit space.
